- ◆ Culture, ethnicity, race, and class are four of the important social factors in the biopsychosocial model that impact the course of a person's addiction problems and recovery. The afternoon training session will focus on the culture of addiction and why people who are addicted just cannot stop using. The training also will address the need for collaborative prevention strategies for professionals and community activists who work with individuals with substance use disorders.
- ◆ These sessions are appropriate for community corrections, criminal justice and behavioral health professionals who are interested in cognitive therapy and intervention with the community corrections and criminal-justice involved populations.
